

Prairie Point Update

Our Prairie Point neighborhood is viewed by the general public as quite a gem! The private entrances, full basements, beautiful finishes, and wide variety of floorplans are just a few of the reasons why our homes are so popular. I recently provided some statistics to the Prairie Point Board and we thought it would be useful information to share with all of our residents and volunteers.

Market Summary

Our current census is 98.4%, which means that 120/122 units are leased. While Prairie Point is made up of 123 homes, we no longer count the model in our census numbers as we do not have plans to lease it. Over the past three years, our occupancy rate has averaged above 98%!

Current Resident Demographics

- Average age 81.24 years
- 51.6% are couples
- Average length of stay at PP is 5.59 years

Where do our residents go when they leave their PP home?

We analyzed the move-outs from Prairie Point in the past three years and found the following details:

- 32.2% moved to Attic Angel Apartments
- 1.6% moved to the Haven

- 3.4% moved to the Households
- 39% passed away
- 20% left the Attic Angel Community (cited reasons such as moving closer to family, financial changes)

Waitlist Information & Demographics

We have a robust and extensive waitlist for our Prairie Point homes. The list of interested parties grows each month; over 70 new potential residents were added since the start of our fiscal year, 4/1/19. 100% of our unit turnovers in the past three years have been leased by members of our waitlist. The average wait from the time a person is added to the list to the time they are offered a home is approximately two years. The waitlist is made up of:

- 236 active singles/couples
- Average age 75.67 years
- 89.3% are from Madison, Middleton, Verona, Waunakee, Cross Plains
- 3% are from other parts of Wisconsin
- 7.7% are from areas out of the state

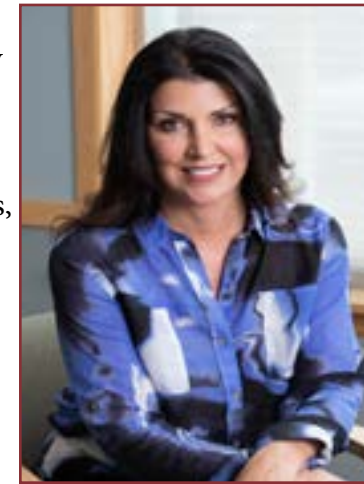

Garage Security

Unfortunately, we continue to see garage doors open for long periods without residents being present. Just recently, Madison police reported thieves had entered a neighboring community through open garages. These are crimes of opportunity and an open garage is an open invitation. As a reminder, please follow these tips to help ensure the safety and security of yourself and neighbors:

- Don't leave the garage door remote in your vehicle – If a thief breaks into your car and steals the remote, he has a way into your home.
- Make sure the door from your garage into your house is as secure as your front door; lock it!
- Don't leave your garage door open – Good neighborhoods are the first place criminals like to drive through to case houses.

Maintenance and Snow Removal

A later than normal snow accumulation allowed for some additional pruning much later in the season than we planned. Now that we have some white stuff on the ground, our focus will shift to keeping driveways and walks free of snow and ice. We have a planned route that we normally take when removing snow. If you require more immediate service due to an emergency or appointment, please let the Maintenance Department know at 662-8828.

In the winter, inclement weather may influence the decision to have a scheduled program or not. It is always prudent, when we are under an advisory or warning, to call the Receptionist the day of any planned activity before making the trek to AAP.
