AAP Board Highlights

The Attic Angel Place Board met in June to discuss a variety of updates, including the annual Wisconsin Coalition for Collaborative Excellence in Assisted Living (WCCEAL) resident satisfaction survey, staffing challenges, and ongoing projects across the campus. Chair Sue Bush opened the meeting by welcoming new board members Shannon Davidson, Carolyn McKinney, Amy Nickles, and Cathy Rotter, and introduced Rebecca Beran, the new Director of Dining Services.



The meeting's education session was focused on the WCCEAL survey results, presented by Tara Bauer and Kim Blum. The survey highlighted Attic Angel's strengths, such as exceptional staff, high resident and family satisfaction, and a strong wellness program. However, it also pointed to areas for improvement, including dining services, staffing consistency, and facility accessibility. Blum shared that efforts are already underway to address these issues, particularly with a new partnership with New Horizon Foods to improve dining services.

Blum also updated the board on ongoing staffing efforts, including a task force focused on reducing the use of agency staff. This has already resulted in a \$30,000 reduction in agency costs since December. Additionally, Blum reported positive feedback on the Wellness program, which includes successful initiatives like Rock Steady Boxing for Parkinson's. There's a strong collaboration between the Wellness Department and Greenfield Rehab (our onsite partner for physical and occupational therapy). Board directors showed interest in touring the wellness and rehab facilities in the future.

Dining services were another focus. New Horizon Foods, which took over in March, has introduced a new menu in the Terrace, and Beran is working closely with residents to gather feedback. There are plans to revitalize the café space, but those plans continue to be assessed.

In terms of infrastructure, the board was briefed on updates to the call light system, which, while functioning well, still has a few minor issues being addressed. The Segoe Heights hallway refresh is also underway, focusing on painting and flooring this year, with furniture and artwork updates scheduled for next year.

During the meeting, the board reviewed and approved the consent agenda, including minutes from previous meetings, financial statements, and departmental reports.

The next AAP board meeting is scheduled for July 14, to review the upcoming audit.

Garden Gab: Garden Packages

A new pilot project at Attic Angel Prairie Point, Garden Packages, are meant to be a plug-and-play garden design solution to add more perennials into the landscape. This year residents could choose from three styles – Prairie, Cottage, or Shrubbery – or design their own Custom Garden with Lead Horticulturist Grace Huddleston. Some residents also decided to design a custom annual flower package. See the photo to the right for an example of an annual flower package, Color Bowl, at the Reiner's house! All in all, there were 24 garden



packages ordered this year. We look forward to improving the product and would like your input during the next Grounds Forum. How did you like the garden packages? Would you be interested in a custom Color Bowl?
